Organized and directed the work of 15-20 resident researchers and of a large network of external researchers (i.e. about 180-200 scholars based in universities, governments and national or international research institutions). Carried out research on: macroeconomics, financial liberalisation, income inequality, transition economics, the demographic and mortality crisis of countries in transition, social assistance and safety nets.
- My work in WIDER entailed also liaising closely with the international agencies (UN-DESA, UNDP, UNCTAD, IMF, World Bank, the United Nations University and so on) and national development agencies which sponsored or co-financed some of the WIDER research programs.
- Finally, as Director of WIDER, I was responsible for fundraising (that improved markedly during my tenure) and for the introduction of several new programs (all of them still in operation as of today), such as a PhD internship, a Visiting Professorship, an Annual WIDER Lecture delivered by several Nobel Laureates and other outstanding scholars, the creation of a database on income inequality, organizing the teaching by WIDER researchers (including myself) of upto four courses on different development topics at the University of Helsinki.
