

The Brics are dead.



Impact of Emerging Powers at WTO


Brazil & India

- Secured substantial SDT for developing countries

China


- Weight behind developing world coalitions
- Central factor in 2008 Doha Round impasse

China's Merchandise Exports





Impact of Emerging Powers at WTO

- 2008 draft agreement SDT for China,
 concessions from US politically untenable in US
- Clash between traditional & emerging powers
- Rise of new powers → breakdown of Doha Round

- How should emerging economies be classified and treated in global trade governance?
- Is there a fundamental conflict between liberal governance institutions and development?
